This English version of the Yearbook of the City of Helsinki is a sample of about 30 tables describing Helsinki in a nutshell.

The statistical yearbook of the city of Helsinki, published since 1905 has traditions as a collection of up-to-date statistics. It contains extensive time series and aims to continuity and comparability of information. Including 300 tables the yearbook is a comprehensive annual statistical description of various phenomena pertaining to Helsinki and its inhabitants.

Some tables also present comparative statistics on the Metropolitan Area, the entire Helsinki Region, the largest Finnish cities and the whole country. The yearbook also has an international section containing data on the Scandinavian capitals and major city regions and on the capitals Tallin (Estonia), Riga (Latvia) and Vilnius (Lithuania), as well as the Russian metropolis St. Petersburg.
